out-of-the-box thinking. How can we build faster and less expensively and still maintain quality? Those challenges are what drew me to construction."

As a project manager for Haselden, Proehl heads the company's Research Support Facilities project team at the National Renewable Energy Laboratory in Golden. Slated for LEED Platinum designation as a "net zero-energy building," the facility boasts a natural ventilation system and other innovative elements for energy savings.

Proehl is also the project manager on the remodel of the Industrial Science Building at Colorado State University. Financed by donations from a group of six general contractors led by Haselden, the \$4-million project will transform the 1883 building into a preconstruction laboratory for the school's Construction Management Department.

As one of four project advertisement advertisement managers on the \$150million Medical Center of the Rockies project, the second hospital in the nation to receive LEED Silver certification, Proehl's responsibilities included mechanical and electrical systems, infrastructure, central utility plant and foundations.

His long involvement with Rotary International includes an active role in the Friends of Christmas Island project. The group supplies the island with donated medical and water-filtration equipment and school supplies.

Proehl also leads Haselden's college recruiting efforts.

"New technologies, such as building information modeling, integrated design and construction programs, will be key factors in determining which companies survive this downturn and which do not."
